

Quirino notes that this is one of the earliest printed images of the Philippines.

The Latin describes a naval encounter near Manila in the 16th century, involving Dutch and Spanish forces, the battle between Olivier van Noort's Dutch squadron and the Spanish fleet under Antonio de Morga. This battle took place on December 14, 1600. During this engagement, the Spanish flagship *San Diego* was lost, but the Spanish managed to capture the Dutch ship *Eendracht*. The battle forced van Noort to withdraw from the Philippines, but he eventually became the first Dutchman to circumnavigate the world. The battle near Manila was part of van Noort's broader campaign against Spanish possessions
