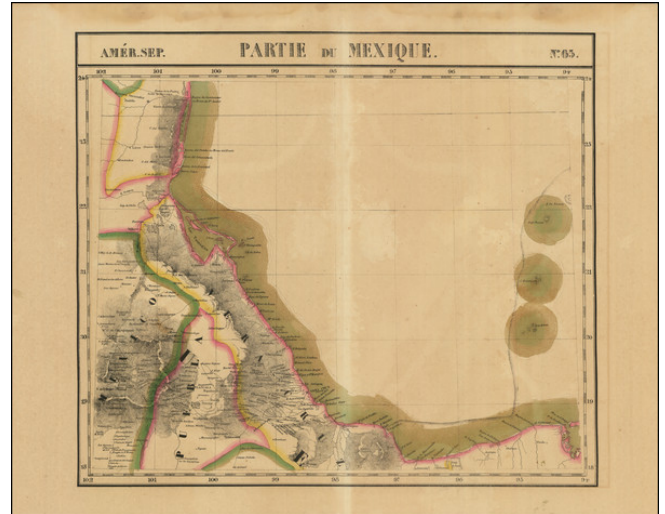

From Vandermaelen's remarkable six-volume atlas, which, if combined as globe gores, forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale.
