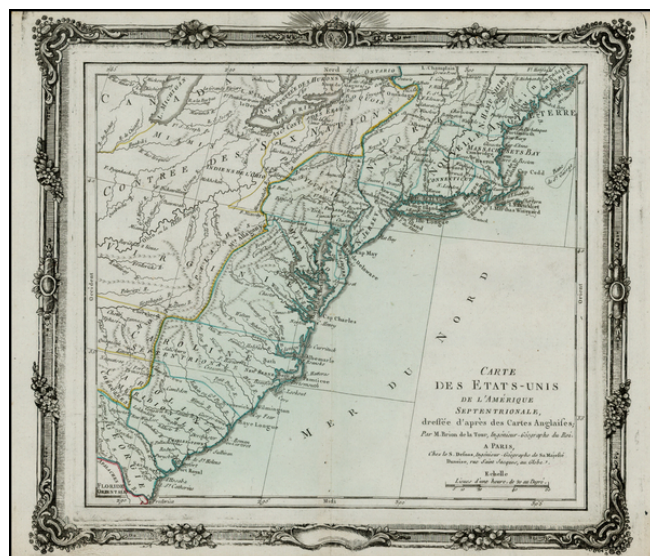

Brion de la Tour's map is one of the earliest obtainable maps to name the US.

The map shows the British Colonies, but limits them to the region east of the Alleghenys & Appalachians. The west remains French & Indian, with forts, settlements, Indian tribes, etc. Nicely detailed & important map. Still no Vermont. Detroit is shown. The Country of the Six Nations is shown, as are a number of early Western Forts. A nice example of this scarce map, which rarely appears on the market, even rarer with the decorative borders.
