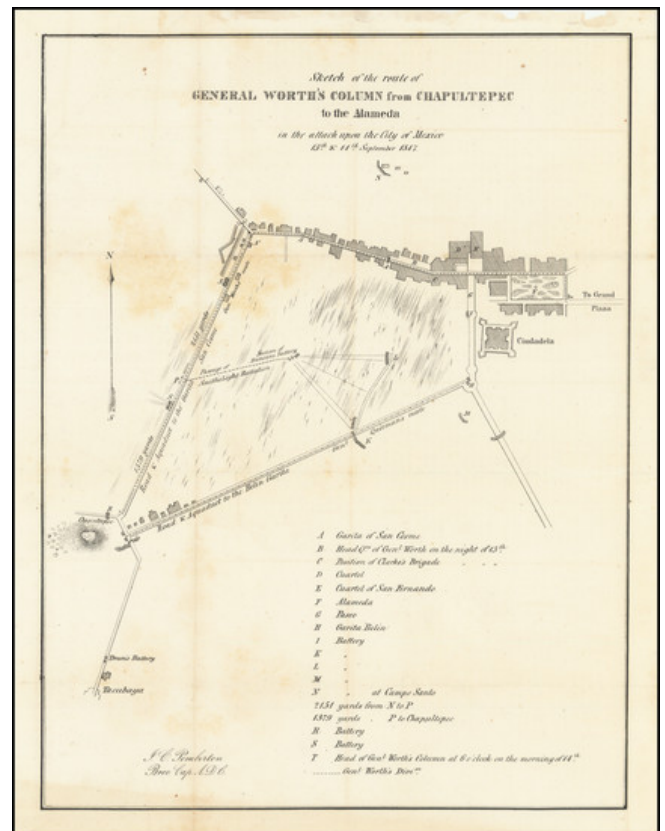
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Sketch of the route of General Worth's Column from Chapultepec to the Alameda in the attack upon the City of Mexico 13th & 14th September 1847
