

Aaron Arrowsmith Jr. Writes To Stansfield Rawson following deather of his father

Interesting letter written by Aaron Arrowmsmith, Junior, in the months following his father's death on April 23, 1823.

Soho Square Dec 31 / 23

The "Essay of a map of Asia Minor," respecting which you enquired in your late letter, is the same as the one of which, I understand, you received a copy some time since; but as the title has not been altered since the publication of it, I do not know how you could overlook having it, excepting from the greatness of your collection. However, I will do myself the pleasure of sending you a copy, at the

same time with the chart you have ordered, which happens to be just now at press, and which I shall delay forwarding till quite dry. "The Outlines of Greece &c." is a very superiour map to the "Environs of Constantinople" being as nearly three times the scale. Its limits on the E. are the G. of Macri (?), Constantinople and Bourgas -- on the N. the Mts. of Balkan (Hamus?) and Glubotin -- on the W. Scutari and the whole chain of the Ionian Is. and on the S. Cerigo, Santorin & Rhodes. It contains the ancient, as well as the modern, names, and has many interesting little plans inserted in the blank spaces.

Accept my warmest thanks per your sympathy, and, young as I am, allow me to follow him in your esteem, whose loss you so kindly regret: perserverence & study will, I hope, render me in worth, of your good offices.
