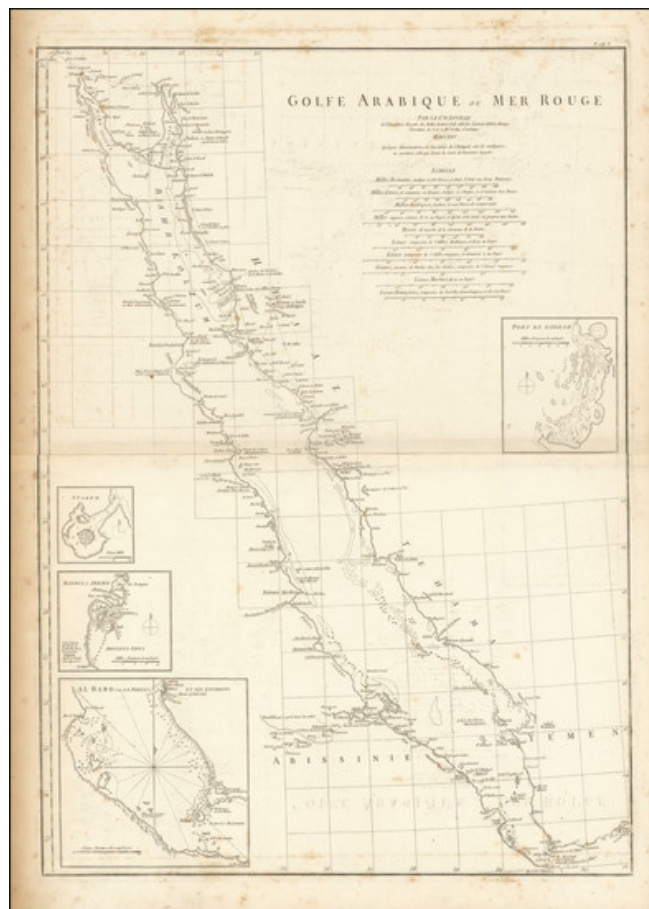

Detailed 2-sheet map of the Red Sea, published by D'Anville, one of the most important scientific mapmakers of the 18th Century.

The map delineates the Red Sea with its adjacent coastlines, covering territories that are now part of modern-day Egypt, Sudan, Eritrea, Yemen, Saudi Arabia, and northern Ethiopia.

The map details caravan routes, coastal settlements, and maritime hazards such as shoals, banks, reefs, and islands, as well as noting safe anchorages. It features four inset plans of Suakem, Matzou et Arkiko, Al Babo (also referred to as 'the gate'), and the Port of Giddah.
