One of Only Three Audubon Night Scenes.

This exquisite double-elephant folio plate from John James Audubon's monumental first edition of *The Birds of America* showcases the Barn Owl, *Tyto alba* (formerly known as *Strix Flammea*), in a captivating nocturnal scene. It features two adult Barn Owls perched on branches against a dramatic backdrop. The upper bird, with wings majestically flared, clutches a chipmunk, identified by Audubon as a "Ground Squirrel (*Sciurus Striatus*)," highlighting the natural predatory behavior of this species. The scene is set high on an overlook, offering a breathtaking view of a river meandering through the countryside below, under the cover of night.
