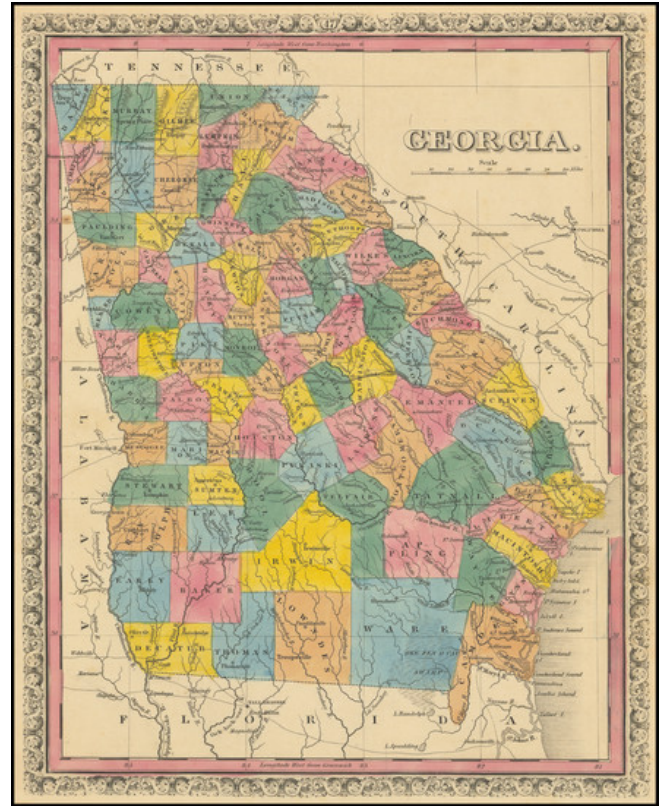

Description:

Very rare Tanner's Geographical Establishment map of the state of Georgia, reworked from the plate first issued in Anthony Finley's *Universal Atlas*, in 1824.

The map is hand-colored by counties and shows towns, roads, rivers, mountains, and other geographical features.

Henry Schenk Tanner's *New General Atlas* was issued following Tanner's sale of his *Universal Atlas* to Samuel August Mitchell. The *Universal Atlas*, which had been published in Philadelphia from 1836 to 1845. Tanner's *New General Atlas*, for which Anthony Finley was also a collaborator, is one of the rarest 19th-century American atlases.
