By 1907, both entities had already established strong reputations, with Metallurgique known for reliability and performance, and Maybach celebrated for his advanced engine designs.

This collaboration resulted in a vehicle equipped with a four-cylinder engine producing around 45 horsepower, a notable achievement for its time. The 1907 Metallurgique Maybach featured a four-speed gearbox and a top speed of approximately 75 miles per hour, demonstrating significant advancements in automotive technology. The robust chassis and elegant bodywork highlighted Metallurgique's meticulous craftsmanship, making the car both powerful and visually stunning.
