The 1904 Renault Park Phaeton stands as a remarkable example of early 20th-century automotive engineering and design. Built in 1904 and registered in 1905, this vehicle is a model VB featuring Park Phaeton coachwork by the prestigious Rothschild et Cie of Paris. Known for their meticulous craftsmanship, Rothschild et Cie lent a touch of elegance and sophistication to this already innovative automobile, making it a coveted possession among the elite of the time.
