

This detailed map of the Black Sea, referred to as *Mare Nigrum*, showcases the surrounding regions including parts of modern-day Turkey, Ukraine, and Eastern Europe. The map features geographical and topographical details such as mountains, rivers, and cities. The three-volume set documents La Motraye's extensive travels across Europe, Asia, and parts of Africa during the late 17th and early 18th centuries. The first two volumes were published in 1723, and a third volume was added in 1732.
