Description:

Faden's plan of Bunker Hill, based upon the work of Captain John Montressor, is one of the earliest and most famous of Faden's battle plans of the American Revolution. The map captures the action in and around the American Fortifications at Breed's Hill and Bunker Hill, in what would become the most famous of all early battles of the American Revolution. Washington had boldly fortified the area under the nose of the British in the days prior to the battle and worked all night to establish strong fortifications the night beforethe battle.

The map includes a unique extra flap which overlays a portion of the map and captures the details of the battle in two phases. Originally engraved by Faden, the map was reissued in Stedman's *History of the American War*. The map shows the postions of the King's Army and the American Positions, along with the ships engaged in the bombardment of the Americans.
