

Description:

Early large format map of the area just east of Ketchikan, Alaska, extending from the area around Prince Rupert, Port Essington, Port Edward and Porcher Island to the area near Carp Lake and Mackenzie, one of the earliest large format regional maps of the area.

From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale.
