Second state of the extremely rare Lord Baltimore Map, first issued in A Relation of Maryland; Together with a Map of the Countrey... Papenfuse speculated that the map may have been prepared by Jerome Hawley and John Lewger, but the maker remains unknown. The map is the first map to focus on Maryland and is of great significance in border disputes with Pennsylvania, where the map was used as evidence by the Penn family against Maryland because the map showed the 40th parallel too far south. The dispute was not settled until the Mason-Dixon line in the 1760s. Drawn from Smith's and Thorowgood's explorations. This state corrects the 40th Parallel. Burden 240. An excellent example with full wide margins and early color. Reinforced at the lower centerfold in the margin.
