To the left and right of the title is an explanation in French of London and its principal buildings. Below the plan are two views, one of Monument - the great doric column designed by Wren and Hooke to commemorate the Great Fire; and the other, St Mary-le-Bow church; another Wren masterpiece that was completed in 1680 and considered at the time the second most important church in London, after St Paul's.

Also below the plan is a 123 item list of the most important streets, hospitals, churches, public buildings, and gateways. The plan bears grid lines for easy reference.
