

Shows the mouth of the Mississippi, from New Orleans southward, along with Appalache Bay and the region just west of Mobile, including the Pascagoula area, Dog Island, Deer Island, St George, St. Joseph, St. Blas, etc. Includes a large population table based on Humboldt, which includes the populations of America, Languages of America (including Indians), and the distributions of races.

The map is a testament to the phenomenal effort Vandermaelen undertook to compile contemporary and highly detailed the most detailed regional maps of the regions to appear in an atlas. Cartographically, the atlas is a magnificent highly detailed work, pulling together the best information for indigenous sources.

This first large format map ever produced for this region. Includes extensive notes throughout the map.
