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
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Bermuda Islands Compiled From The Most Recent Admiralty Surveys 1876 . . . 1881 (St. George Harbour and Environs Inset)

Description:

Detailed separately issued sea chart of Bermuda, with a large inset plan of St. George Harbour, first published by the British Admiralty in London in 1877 and updated to 1881.

The present example was apparently updated in 1881 to include an inset of Grassy Bay and Irleand Island for the first time.

The inset of St. George's Harbour is of particular note, one of the largest and most detailed depictions of the Harbor and environs published in the 19th Century. The Harbor, St. George Island, Smith Island and St. David Island are depicted in fine detail, as is the Ship Channel from Murrray Anchorage.

Several lighthouses are depicted. The soundings (in fathoms) around the island are remarkably detailed.

The Chart includes a paste down label for Edward Stanford, London's leading map seller in 2nd half of the 19th Century.
