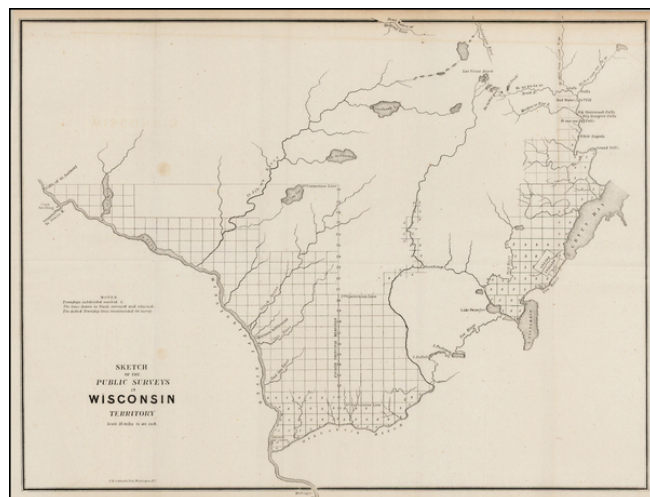

Description:

Fine example of one of the earliest obtainable maps focused on Wisconsin Territory.

The map extends west to the Falls of St. Anthony and Fort Snelling, and north to the Headwaters of the Montreal River, Ontonagon River and the area north of Green Bay.

The only non-Indian settlements noted are Pairie du Chien and the Mormon settlement on the Mississippi River. The Mormons first settled near the confluence of the Mississippi River and the Black River in 1839, where they engaged in logging. The present settlement would become the Pinery Mission.
