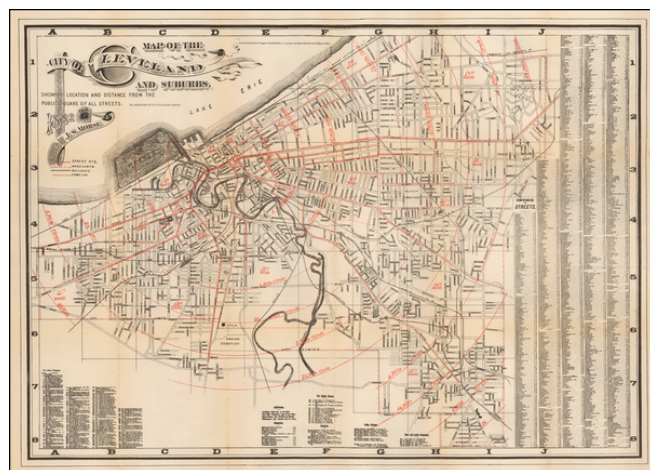
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### Map of the City of Cleveland and Suburbs, Showing Location and Distance From The Public Square of All Streets. 1882 . . .

Fine early map of Cleveland, published by J.S. Morse and lithographed by W.J. Morgan & Co. of Cleveland, Ohio.

The map shows Cleveland, centered around the Cuyahoga River. The city is divided by wards, with street railways shown in red and regional railroads in black. A circular pattern shows distances from the center of town in the First Ward, at the intersection of Euclid, Woodland, Ontario and Broadway.

A list at the bottom left show the Fire Alarm Telegraph number for several hundred buildings. To the right are lists identifying Auditoriums, Cemeteries, Fire Engine Houses, Hospitals, Police Stations and Hook and Ladder Companies. At the far right is a street index.
