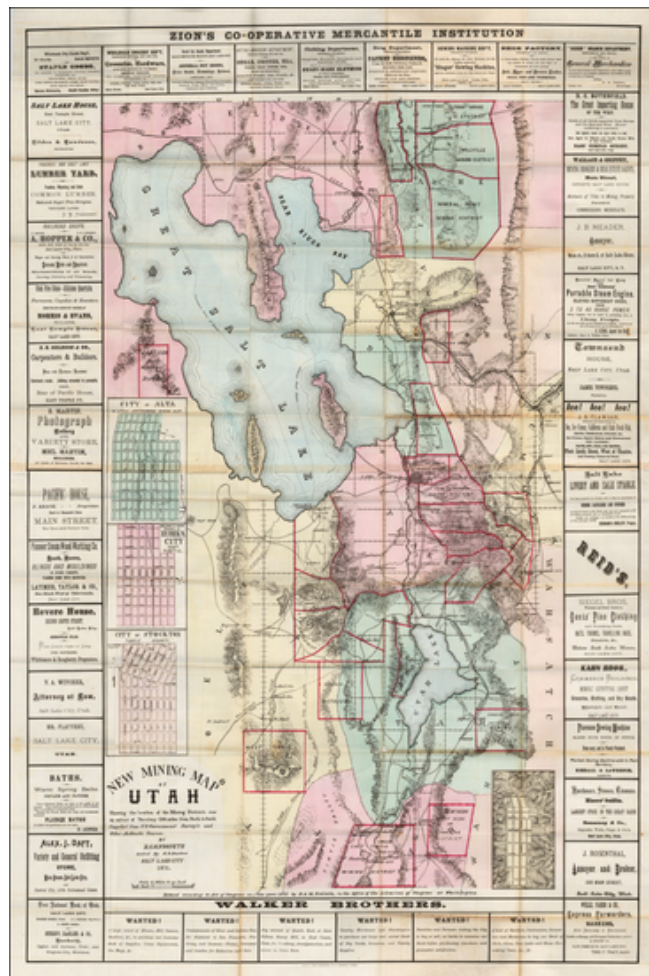

At the top of the map is a title reading "Zion's Co-operative Mercantile Institution." Zion's Cooperative Mercantile Institution (ZCMI) was the first department store in the United States. It was founded on October 9, 1868 by Brigham Young. For many years it used the slogan, "America's First Department Store".

The surrounding advertisements, for all manner of businesses, hotels, boarding houses, etc., are instructive in themselves. T

he title on the cover reads "New mining map of Utah : showing 28 prominent mining districts and location of the best known mines." Pencil name of H. Sill, Odgen, 1876, on the back of the map.
