## **Description:**

Stiking full color example of Ogilby's map of the Southern tip of South America.

This is one of the most embellished examples of this regional map ever produced. Includes 5 cartouches, 3 compass roses, over a dozen sailing ships and a number of ostriches and penguins, plus local hunters.

This view appeared in John Ogilby's seminal work, *America: Being the Latest, and Most Accurate Description of the New World*, published in London in 1671. Ogilby's work is an English translation of Arnoldus Montanus' *Die Nieuwe en onbekende Weereld...*, published in Amerstdam, although greatly expanded in some instances and with new maps and views.
