Highly detailed map of Armenia and environs, published by Edward Stanford.

The map also covers Azerbaydzhan, southern Georgia, and northeastern Turkey.

Note indicates that "the Russian areas are based upon the Russian Official Survey . . . the Turkish area upon Mr. Lynch's Surveys and Notes, the map of the Turco-Persian Frontier and by Russian and English Officers in 1849-55, and much new material hitherto unpublished.

The map was issued in the same year as the Armenian Genocide. In 1915, the Ottoman Empire systematically carried out a campaign of ethnic cleansing. This was preceded by a wave of massacres in the years 1894 to 1896, and another one in 1909 in Adana.

On April 24, 1915, Ottoman authorities rounded up, arrested, and deported 235 to 270 Armenian intellectuals and community leaders from Constantinople to the region of Ankara, where the majority of which were murdered. The genocide was carried out during and after World War I and implemented in two phases—the wholesale killing of the able-bodied male population through massacre and subjection of army conscripts to forced labor, followed by the deportation of women, children, the elderly, and the infirm on death marches leading to the Syrian Desert.
