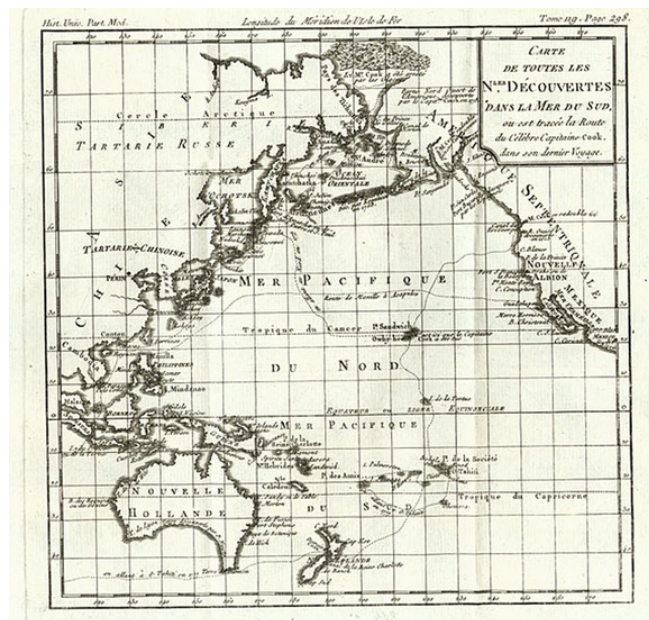

Description:

Scarce interesting map of the West Coast of America, from Alaska to the Baja, the east coast of Asia, and Oceania, showing Cook's tracks during his third voyage. The map follows Cook from the Indian Ocean to New Zealand, between the islands and on to Tahiti and the Society Islands, then north to Hawaii. The route along the NW Coast and then across to the NE Coast of Asia and southward are also shown. A primitive bit of coastal information is shown, with mention of Port Bucarelli, as discovered by the Spanish, etc. A note of Cook's furthest reach north in 1778 is shown and the point at which he was turned back by Ice north of the Behring Straits. Includes reference to other discoveries and explorers. Van Diemen's Land is still attached to Australia. A scarce early map, not mentioned in Wagner. Clean dark impression.
