



Nice map of Ohio from an early edition of Finley's *New General Atlas*, colored by counties and showing towns, roads, rivers, mountains and other geographical features.

The western portion of the state lacks several counties. One of the best maps of the state during the period.

Anthony Finley was the dominant map maker in the United States from the early 1820s through 1831. His atlas was a huge success, far outselling rival atlases by Carey & Lea and Tanner. Its elegant engraving style, high quality paper and topographical detail made it the best regularly published atlas, with maps corrected and updated as often as yearly during the run.
