#### Description:

Original antique map of Chesheshire, in northwestern England. Immediately south of Liverpool and Manchester, this county is shown in fabulous detail.

The map shows forests, mountains, cities, towns, and more. Cities shown include Chester, Stockport, Warrington, and "Leverpole" (Liverpool). Parts of adjacent counties, including Staffordshire, Flintshire, Denbighshire, Shropshire, and Yorkshire are shown.

This map was first published by Robert Morden in London at the end of the 17th century. This edition of the map includes an updated spelling and was published at the start of the 18th century. For example, Brinston in Wire Hall Hundred has been updated to the correct name of Brimstage.

#### Detailed Condition:

Dark impression. Minor offsetting. Significant soiling and reinstated loss to lower fifth of map.
