

The Earliest Obtainable Plans of Orlando, Florida.

Extremely early town plan of Orlando, Florida, published by the local newspaper the *South Florida Sentinel*.

The map is undated but includes on the verso a miniaturized version of J. O. Fries's <u>Map of Orange</u> County Florida from 1890.

The *South Florida Sentinel* was founded as a weekly publication in 1885 and operated until 1899, when it was consolidated with the *Orange County Reporter*. It restarted operations in 1907, operating as a weekly newspaper until 1913, when it became a morning daily.

Frank Woodruff, shown as an Orange County Commissioner, was elected commissioner in 1910.

Rarity

OCLC lists 4 copies of the pamphlet "Orlando Charm of the South" (University of Florida; Orange County Library, University of Miami, University of Central Florida.

Other than Sanborn Company fire insurance maps, this is the earliest map of Orlando listed in OCLC.
