The print depicts the Ponca encampment on the banks of the Missouri River near Bazile Creek. This was the point where the steamer *Yellowstone* dropped off three Ponca Indians who had joined the party of Prince Maximilian Zu Wied Neu-Wied during their travels up the Missouri River in May 1833.

The view shows the three, including chief Schuh-De-Gá-Che (He Who Smokes) arriving ashore, with a welcoming party and village in the background.
