

Large format map of the region bounded by Bathurst, Cornwallis, and Devon Islands in the northernmost reaches of Arctic Canada.

This is one of the most detailed maps of the English discoveries in the Arctic region in the early 19th century, including numerous details regarding the tracks of explorers in the region. Numerous descriptions of the coastlines are included.

This map originally appeared in Vandermaelen's remarkable six-volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale.
