## Description:

The rare first state of Jo Mora's marvelous map of California, the first example of this famous artist's marvelous whimsical "Topographic Cartes."

The map includes an inset panel illustrating El Camino Real and all of its stops between San Francisco Solano (Sonoma) and San Diego. Dates by the missions show the progress of the Spanish into California from the end of the 18th century to the beginning of the 19th.

The map has a Roaring '20s feel, with bootleggers mocking Customs or Coast Guard boats outside the all-important 12-mile line.

His map work included this map of California, first version (1927), Grand Canyon (1931), Yosemite (1931),



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Yellowstone (1936), Carmel-By-The-Sea (1942), *California* (1945) (large and small versions), Map of Los Angeles (1942), Monterey Peninsula (date unknown), and Seventeen Mile Drive (date unknown).
