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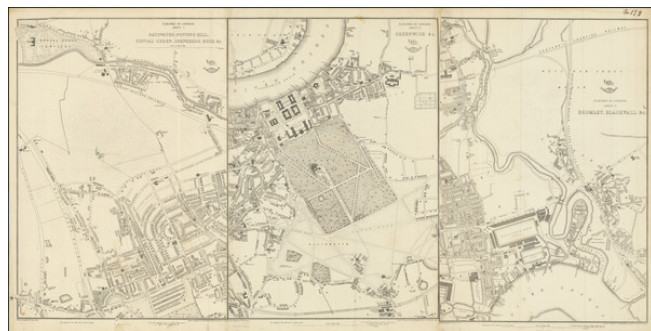

An unusual presentation of the first three sheets from Edward Weller's supplement of suburban regions from his nine-sheet map of London.
