Description:

Scarce 18th-century French engraved map of Rome, created to assist with the understanding of Roman history.

The map was based on the research of Pirro Ligorio, Alessandro Donati, and Famiano Nardini, and was made to be consistent with an accurate plan of Rome published by Domenico de Rossi during the pontificate of Innocent XII.

The map shows the regions and quarters of Rome as they were divided by Augustus, with clear boundaries and numbering.

It was created by the geographer D'Anville, and includes the major landmarks and buildings of ancient Rome, such as the Porta Capena, the Circus Flaminius, and the Temple of Peace.

The map also includes a scale in French feet and Roman miles.

Delahaye signed the map as the engraver.
