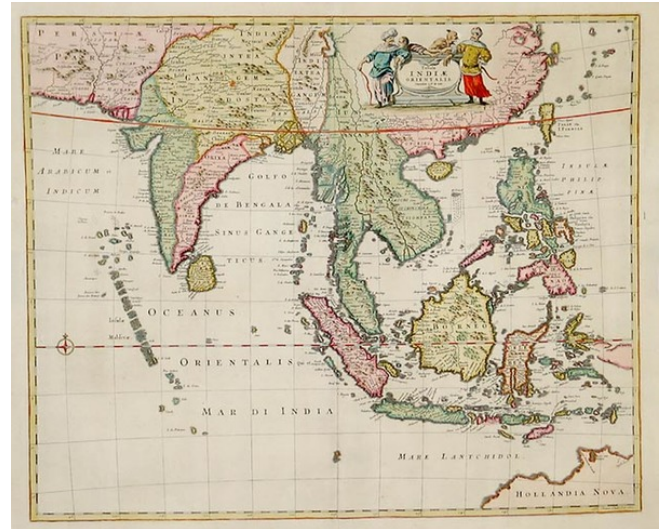

Description:

Gorgeous example of De Wit's map of Southeast Asia, engraved by Joannes Lhulier in 1662. The map shows from southeastern Persia to northwestern Australia. Focus is on India, Southeast Asia, and the East Indies with the Phillipines. The many islands are clearly depicted, with ports shown as the most important information. The Celebes Islands were then being developed for the spice trade which would lead to hostilities among the European powers. This map served as the prototype for Speed's map of SE Asia, issued by Francis Lamb in the 1676 edition of Speed's Atlas. Minor printer's crease and a few minor marginal tears, repaired on the verso such that they are virtually invisible. Gorgeous full color example.
