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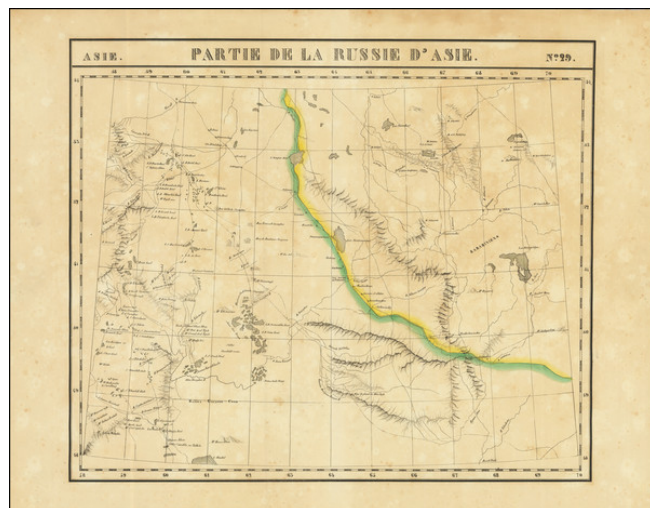

Very detailed large format map of the Kazakhstan - Russian border north of the Aral Sea, published by Philippe Vandermaelen in Brussels.

The map shows a variety of features, including roads, mountains, lakes, rivers, lead mines, political borders, and more. The extent of various ethnic groups, including the Little Hord and the Barabiniens, are shown. This would have been one of the most detailed maps of the region at the time.

This map first appeared in Vandermaelen's remarkable 6-volume atlas of the world. The atlas is composed of sheets covering the entire known world at the time, which, if combined as globe gores, form an immense globe. As such, Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale.
