Morrissey's Gold Gulch project seems to have had a short burst of activity, with a note in the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* and *The Austin American* on November 25, 1931 and notes in the *Arizona Republic* (October 2, 1932) and *El Paso Herald Post* (November 5, 1932).
