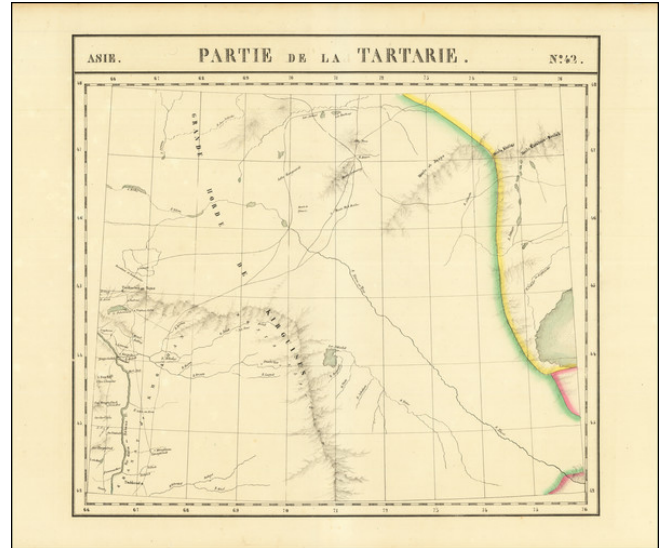

Description:

An interesting example of Vandermaelen's atlas map of southern Kazhakstan, showing the region in the most accurate detail that would have been available to cartographers of the period.

This map shows the region just east of the Aral Sea, extending to the western end of Lake Baikal. Rivers, lakes, towns, roads, and more are all shown in this remote part of the Asian continent.

This map first appeared in Vandermaelen's remarkable 6-volume atlas of the world. The atlas is composed of sheets covering the entire known world at the time, which, if combined as globe gores, form an immense globe. As such, Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale.
