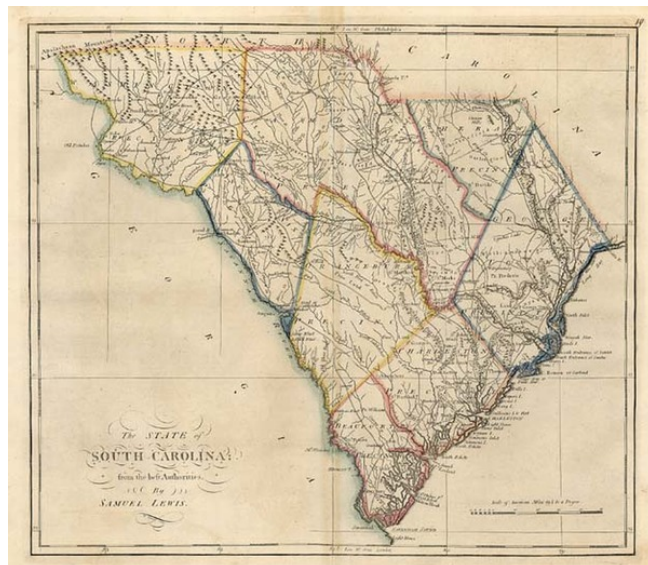

Gorgeous wide-margined example of Carey's map of South Carolina, hand colored by counties. This is the 1814 edition of Lewis' map, first issued in William Guthrie's *New System of Modern Geography*, published in 1795. The map provided a large format and highly detailed map of the state, showing towns, roads, rivers, mountains, swamps, counties, meeting houses, and substantial other detail. Highly detailed throughout. Carey's *General Atlas* published in 1814 is believed to be the first American Atlas to be offered for sale with hand coloring on the maps. A beautiful example, with particularly fine coloring.
