

This 17th-century geographical documentation illustrates a profound understanding of the East Asian region, reflective of the growing Western interest in these territories.

The late 17th century was a period marked by burgeoning Western exploration and increasing maritime trade with Asia. Seller, as the foremost British chart and instrument maker of his era, was at the forefront of these developments. His depiction of China, particularly with the Great Wall, shows an awareness of the country's distinct geographical features. The Wall, long a symbol of China's isolationism, signifies the challenges that Western merchants and explorers faced in establishing relations with the Qing dynasty China.
