

Highly detailed map of Wyoming Territory, showing towns, rivers, the Union Pacific Railroad, trails, mountains, lakes, and only 7 counties. Sublette's Road, North Platte Wagon Road, and the Overland Mail Route are shown. Fremont's Peak is noted as the "loftiest known summit" in the Wind River Range, and although the elevation is accurate, it is now considered the third highest, after Gannett Peak and Grand Teton. Johnson County is labeled "Pease" as it was known until it was renamed in 1879 after E. P. Johnson, a Cheyenne attorney.
