## Description:

A fascinating testament to the geographical and political configuration of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (U.R.S.S.) alongside an engaging display of the Soviet Union's individual republics' flags and emblems.

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The sheet includes a range of conventional signs, distinguishing features such as the boundaries of the U.R.S.S., the capitals of the individual socialist republics, and the locations of major cities. The second part of the sheet, Drapeaux et Armes de L'U.R.S.S. et des 15 Republiques Socialistes Sovietiques Federees includes vibrant displays of the Soviet Union's flag and coat of arms, along with those of the fifteen federated socialist republics, contributing to the rich tapestry of Soviet iconography.
