Survey map of the District of Alaska, showing the extensive mineral resources of the area: gold, silver, copper, tin, coals, petroleum, marble, and gypsum. The military telegraph, constructed from 1900 to 1905 as the United States federal government's first major infrastructure project in Alaska, is delineated.

The chief geologist for Alaska noted on the map, Alfred H. Brooks, became the eponym for the Brooks Range after his death. Here, the range is labeled as the Baird and Endicott Ranges.
