## **Description:**

Striking double hemisphere map of the world, surrounded by several smaller maps displaying various projections. Embedded in the dark background area are windheads that recall world maps of the early 16th century. On closer examination, Seutter's map has a number of highly peculiar delineations. The shape of Japan is downright bizarre, and the fictional Yesso Land, normally found in far northeastern Asia, has become a part of Japan's main island, nearly tripling its size. California is shown as an island at a relatively late date. A nice example in full wash colors, with the windheads tastefully colored, which is not usually the case. A bit of marginal soiling and a minor fold repaired fold split at the bottom, but generally a nice decorative example.
