

The phrase "Tonique Byrrh à base quinquina fortifiant" translates from French to English as "Byrrh Tonic based on fortifying quinine."

Byrrh is a French aperitif made of red wine, mistelle, and quinine. Quinine is a bitter compound derived from the bark of the cinchona tree and has historically been used as a treatment for malaria and as a flavoring in tonic water. The term "fortifiant" indicates that this tonic is intended to have strengthening or invigorating properties.
