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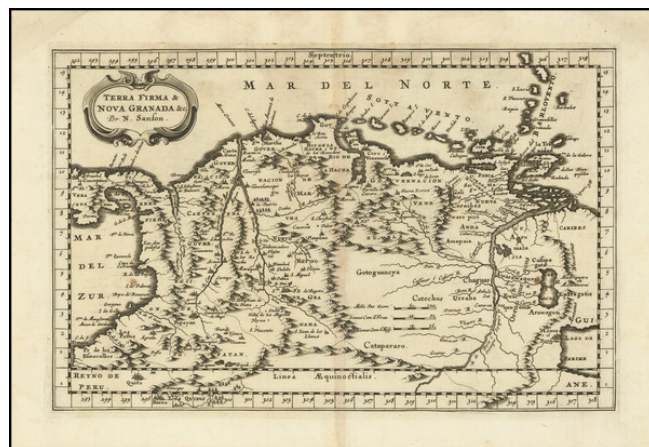

Description:

Fine old color example of Sanson's important early map of the region bounded by Peru and Columbia in the west to Venezuela and part of Lago De Parime in the east, covering the Dutch Antilles, Trinidad, Tobago, S. Vincente S. Lucia, etc.

The map covers the region which would become New Granada under Simon Bolivar, 150 years later, but is still controlled by the Spanish, who at the time were developing the region, especially around Quito, for its vast mineral resources. Many major cities appear, as do rivers, lakes, mountains, islands and other details.

One of the earliest obtainable regional maps of this area.

This example is from Johann Zurner's Die Gantz Erd-Kugel, published in Frankfurt in 1679. The Zurner edition is the only edition to include the title in Spanish.
