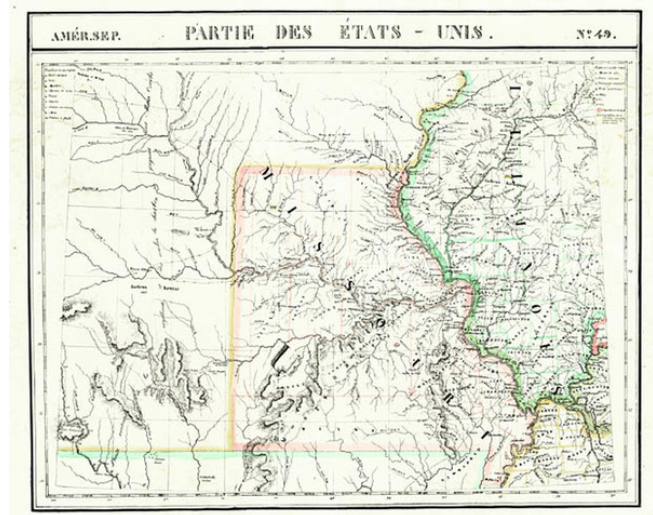

Description:

Remarkable map of the region, only a few years after Missouri gained its statehood. Early primitive counties shown throughout Missouri and Illinois, just a few years after each gained its statehood. The map is centered on the Missouri River, extending to the Platte and Omaha regions. Includes excellent contemporary Trans-Mississippi West information. Notes on Indian Tribes and village populations, explorers routes, etc. in Kansas, Nebraska and Indian Territory. One of the best regional maps of the period. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale. His treatment of the Western US is a landmark in the history the cartography of the Western US, undertaking to map in 20 sheets a region which American publishers were virtually ignoring. A fine unfolded and probably separately issued example of this pair of maps covering the Baja. A bit of soiling and spotting, but overall a good example.
