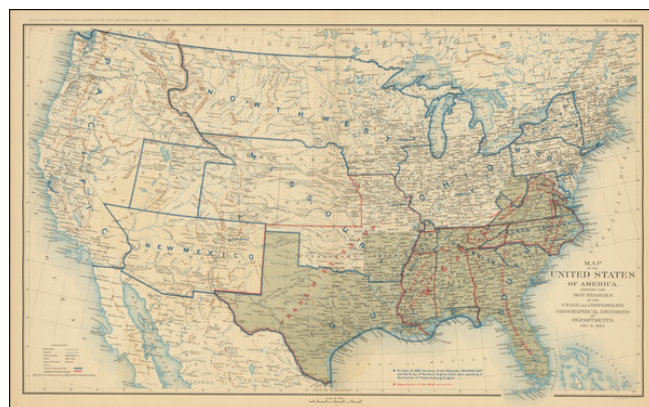
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Map of the United States of America, Showing Boundaries of the Union and Confederate Geographical Divisions and Departments, Dec. 31, 1862

Description:
