Description:

Important early map of Michigan engraved by Bowen & Company for the General Land Office and prepared by Joseph Grolinski. This is perhaps the most detailed and accurate of all early Michigan maps. The extent of the township surveys are noted. Iron, Copper and Silver mines are noted. The land grant railroads and their six mile limits are noted, along with 15 and 20 miles limits. Completed railroads and projected railroads are also noted. Land office seats and also noted. These linen backed GLO maps are becoming increasingly rare on the market and are an essential part of the early cartography of most states west of the Mississippi and important maps for state collectors. Minor fold split, but generally in excellent condition.
