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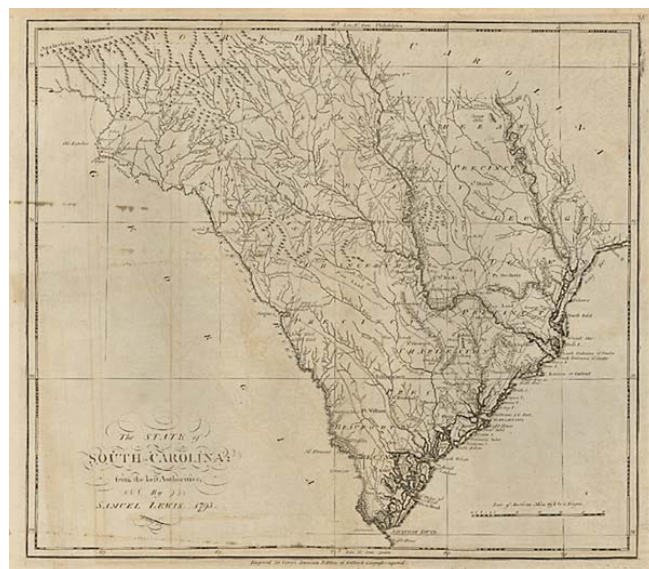

Nice example of the first edition, first state of Mathew Carey's map of South Carolina, published in Carey's American Atlas. Carey's American Atlas was the first atlas published in the United States, compiling a number of excellent maps from indigenous sources in the first compilation of American maps. This map was engraved by Samuel Lewis. It shows remarkable early detail, including towns, the 8 precincts, roads, rivers, lakes, court houses, and a host of other details. The map includes excellent topographical detail, although because of an error, the map is elongated to the North and South. There are boundary errors on the Pee Dee River and with Georgia. This first state of the map can be distinguished from the later states by the lack of a page number in the upper right corner. An essential map for South Carolina Collectors. Wheat & Brun 601.
